

TIS In SOMALILAND

TIS-DAI is implementing activities worth \$ 6,069,844 across Somaliland in Hargeisa, Burao, las'anod, Erigavo, Berbera, Odweyne, Badhan, Aynabo, Zeila, Goda, Mayd, Gabiley, Baligubadle and Borama totaling 83 grants.

All grants are jointly designed, implemented, evaluated and promoted by government officials and community representatives. The aim of the process is to ensure consensus is cultivated, collaborative relationships are formed and confidence is restored between governments, civil society and the private sector.

TIS has partnered with the Ministry of Interior in Construction of Ministry of Interior Headquarter Buildings and in facilitating of peace conferences in Borama, Burao and Sheikh. To enable the ministry of public works, housing and transport (MPWH&T) have professional and modern administrative offices, TIS constructed three regional offices for MPWH&T in Las'anod, Berbera and Hargeisa, TIS also provided consultants, experts in the field to assist MPWH&T develop its strategic plan. To strengthen the central governments capacity to convey information on peace and security, broadcasting equipment, furniture and vehicles were provided to Ministry of Information.

In improving service delivery, TIS has constructed and rehabilitated local government offices in Borama, Goda, Odweyne, Mayd, Gar'adag, Gabiley, Baligubadle, sheikh, Las'anod, and Erigavo.

In Improving public transport and accessibility, TIS has invested in construction of roads in Burao, Gabiley, Erigavo and Las'anod.

Construction of marketplaces, rehabilitation and construction of sports stadiums, Women centers and solid waste management are among other activities TIS has invested in Somaliland.

SOMALILAND Phase Two Activities

Following successful planning sessions on February 2014, with the Ministry of Interior and Ministry of National Planning and Development and in Sool and Sanaag regions, TIS will be investing in the following phase two activities;

Construction and equipping of a two storey extension building with 10 offices for the Ministry of National planning and development to provide adequate working space for staff, printing and publishing of the regional development plan books, provision of GIS hardware and software equipment to handle national resource mapping and procurement of double cab 4WD vehicle to undertake Monitoring and Evaluation activities in all regions of Somaliland.

In partnership with the ministry of interior, TIS will equip and provide IT equipment for MOI headquarter office, procurement of ICT equipment for regional and local government offices, grading of one Hargeisa township road to tarmac standards, installation of solar streetlights in the sha'ab area of Hargeisa town and construction of a football stadium in Hargeisa municipality.

In Erigavo, The community prioritized the construction of three tarmac roads within Erigavo town. In las'anod TIS will invest in construction of two tarmac roads, construction and furnishing of a governor's office and procurement of a motor grader.
