INTRODUCTION



GEOGRAPHY AND PEOPLE

The Republic of Somaliland is a country located in the Horn of Africa, which is in the easternmost part of the African continent. It covers an estimated surface area of 176,119 square kilometers (68,000 square miles). Somaliland is bordered by Djibouti to the northwest, Ethiopia to the south, Somalia to the east, and the Gulf of Aden to the north. The country boasts a coastline of approximately 850 kilometers along the Gulf of Aden. Somaliland has a terrain that includes mountain ranges that rise to elevations of 1,800 meters in the central regions and up to 2,100 meters in the eastern parts of the country. The climate is predominantly arid to semi-arid, with hot temperatures and irregular rainfall patterns.

The population of Somaliland is culturally homogeneous, with all residents speaking the Somali language and practicing Islam. Society is organized into clans and sub-clans, which play a significant role in the social and political structure. The strong, close-knit family ties and clan affiliations are central to Somaliland's social fabric.

HISTORY AND POLITICAL OVERVIEW

Somaliland gained independence from Britain on June 26, 1960. On July 1, 1960, it united with Italian Somalia, a territory under a U.N. mandated Italian Trusteeship; to form the Somali Republic. Following a period of civil unrest and the collapse of the central Somali government in the late 1980s and early 1990s, Somaliland declared its independence once more on May 18, 1991. This decision was made during the Congress of the Council of Clan Elders held in Burao from April 27 to May 15, 1991.

The Republic of Somaliland's independence was constitutionally affirmed on May 31, 2001, through a national referendum on its constitution, which was approved by 97% of voters. Since then, Somaliland has conducted several elections including three local municipal elections (2002, 2012, and 2021), two parliamentary elections (2005 and 2021), and four presidential elections (2003, 2010, 2017 and 2024).

The governance structure of Somaliland is a democratic system with a multi-party framework. The administrative structure consists of three branches which are the Judiciary, the Legislature (comprising the

House of Elders and the House of Representatives), and the Executive headed by the President, vice president and appointed Council of Ministers.

ADMINISTRATION

Somaliland is administratively divided into six main regions namely; Awdal, Marodijeh, Sahil, Togdheer, Sanaag, and Sool. In addition, there are eight officially recognized sub-regions namely Badhan, Buhodle, Daadmadheedh, Gabiley, Hawd, Salel, Saraar, and Xaysimo. These administrative units are further sub-divided into main 23 districts, each governed by an elected local council. Hargeisa serves as the capital city and the seat of government, hosting the country's key political, administrative, and economic institutions.

CLIMATE

Somaliland has an arid to semi-arid climate, characterized by high temperatures, low and erratic rainfall, and significant seasonal and regional variations. The year is generally divided into four main seasons: the Gu (April - June), the main rainy season; the Hagaa (July - September), a hot dry period; the Deyr (October - November), a shorter rainy season; and the Jilaal (December - March), the long dry season. Average annual rainfall ranges from less than 100 mm in the coastal plains to over 500 mm in the more elevated regions, but rainfall is often unpredictable and localized. Temperatures in the lowland areas can exceed 40 °C during the hottest months, while the highland regions enjoy milder conditions. These climatic patterns strongly influence agriculture, pastoralism, and water availability, making drought a recurring challenge for livelihoods and food security.

NATURAL RESOURCES

Somaliland possesses a variety of natural resources that play an important role in supporting its economy and livelihoods. The country's main natural assets include extensive rangelands for pastoralism, fertile valleys for limited rain-fed and irrigated agriculture, and rich marine resources along its Gulf of Aden coastline. Its rangelands support livestock particularly camels, goats, and sheep which form the backbone of the economy and a major export commodity. The coastal waters are home to diverse fish species, offering potential for sustainable fisheries development. Somaliland is also believed to hold untapped mineral deposits, including gypsum, limestone, precious stones, and possible oil reserves. In addition, the country has significant deposits of sand and gravel used in construction. These resources, if managed sustainably, present opportunities for economic diversification, job creation, and long-term development.

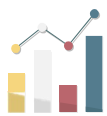

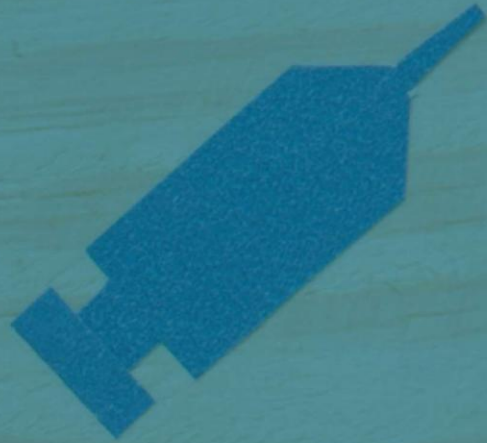
